Research questions of interest to entrepreneurship scholars involve the actors, actions, "resources", and outcomes associated with the entrepreneurial process. On the other hand, research questions of interest to operations management scholars focus on the efficient and effective conversion of a firm's "resources" into good and services to maximize the profit of the firm. In that sense, both ENT & OM scholars have a shared interest in studying issues related to resource management.

In this session we will explore the impact of temporal dynamics and the role of time in the management of both tangible and intangible resources in entrepreneurial firms.
